The Zemganno Sisters

A film by Lou-Anna Reix

Chiara, a talented young acrobat, falls during her solo performance and becomes paraplegic. She retreats with her sister Nina to their childhood home on the wild Aubrac plateau. Between anger, silence, and resilience, the two women try to reconnect. Alone in this vast landscape, Chiara slowly rebuilds herself and learns to live again with her new body. A poetic and physical story about sisterhood, the power of movement, and the courage to start over after a fall.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE •• I wanted to tell the story of a woman whose body, once a tool of freedom, suddenly becomes her greatest challenge. "Les Sœurs Zemganno" explores the fine line between fragility and strength, through the lens of circus and movement. The film is inspired by my own fears of loss and by my family's experience with disability. I aim to create a sensory, intimate film where silence, breath, and landscape express what words cannot — a story of resilience and rebirth.

France, September 1981. Sira, a Malian woman in her early thirties, lives in France with her husband Malick and her daughter Abi, 6 years old. Sira doesn't speak French but has been able to get by in her everyday life and most importantly, she was able to recreate bits of the village, Somankidy, in her new French home. But in this year 1981, Abi starts school for the first time. And the little girl speaking poor French, the school strongly recommends that French be spoken every day at home and that Soninke be dropped. Sira refuses.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE As a French woman, I speak French, and I can speak English and Spanish too. But throughout my life, I lost one language: Soninké, the language of my mother. And for a time, I couldn't communicate with my own mother, because I was losing all my Soninké words and my mother couldn't still speak French. Langue Maternelle questions the invisible damages and sacrifices that women like my mother had to bear so that their children could be considered as French. Losing a language is not only about losing words, but also about losing a cultural heritage. I would like to give voice to the silence of all these mothers who, for years, raised their children and watched them drifting away from the native culture. All, in the name of integration.

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
L'Accompagnante

Lison's well-ordered life is turned upside down when she decides to take in her mother, Rose, who is suffering from terminal cancer. As a deeply intimate mother-daughter bond is rekindled, Lison begins to experience the same symptoms as Rose... Psychosomatic transference or real illness? Little by little, the boundaries between care, love, and contagion begin to blur.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE 1 L'Accompagnante is born from an intimate experience: accompanying a dying mother to the very end. Through Lison, a young woman who feels her mother's illness seeping into her own body, the film explores the blurred line between love, care, and self-erasure. Blending drama with organic horror, it reveals the invisible pain of caregivers — bodies and minds consumed by compassion. The house becomes a mirror of Lison's psyche, humor a fragile survival tool, until suffocation sets in. It is a story about emotional contagion, the dissolution of self, and the radical nature of love.

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We At The Nightclub Suffer Together

A film by Diego Bragà

Fiction

Status: research and music composition completed, screenplay in advanced stage of development, seeking co-production





In a future Brazil occupied by Europe, a trans Brazilian Miss Universe - a Latin, illegal "doll" - seeks refuge on the shores of Copacabana. Beneath the sand lies a forgotten bunker, once a gay nightclub during the military dictatorship, frequented by her uncle. Barred from entering this temple of hypermasculinity, she finally crosses its threshold to confront the gay ghosts of 160 men from 14 nations. Guided by a real archive inherited from her uncle, fiction and patriarchal memory merge. The bunker transforms into a spectral, enchanted discotheque - where homoerotism is reborn through a transfeminist lens, turning pain into music and imagining a tender, collective future.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE IFor seven years, I have immersed myself in the inheritance of 1,000 objects left behind by my uncle, Ricardo Wagner - an openly HIV+ gay man who protected my childhood. This time was necessary to write, compose, and transform grief into a magical musical feature, turning his archive into cinema. In art, trans narratives are still largely confined to pain and loneliness, rarely to joy. With WE AT THE NIGHTCLUB..., I lead a project that affirms the right to imagine a beautiful future, where all feminine souls - trans and beyond - can exist with love, power, playfulness, and freedom.

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Displacement

A film by Sara N. Santos

70', Experimental documentary

Status: early stage of development, looking for a producer





Displacement explores the entangled relationship between landscape, memory and extractivism in Portugal. Merging immersive imagery, archival traces, and fragmented soundscapes, it moves through territories scarred by erasure: abandoned mines, villages flooded by dams, quarries, solar farms, and industrial forests. Through echoes of lost voices and disrupted histories, the film reveals how development reshapes both land and remembrance, turning lived geographies into spectral terrains.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE Portugal is filled with territories that once held life and identity but now stand hollowed out by decades of extractive development. What remains after the promise of progress has failed? What do we hear when the machines stop? Neither purely observational nor explanatory, the film becomes a kind of slow, sensorial archaeology: digging not only into the physical terrain, but also into the social and emotional scars it carries. This is a quiet confrontation with the futures we are still building and the costs we continue to bury under the surface.

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Cement And Concrete

Status: script writing, early development





Late 70s. In an extravagant mansion in southern Portugal, the megalomaniac and famous painter, Eulália, is forced to attempt a new art form — sculpting her body — all the while also facing the new, rebellious young maid, an aspiring pop-rock star, Joana. Between plagiarism, stolen songs, and impossible sculptures, an absurd and cruel artistic duel unfolds. The result? The world's most sublime and grotesque masterpiece: two women petrified inside a sculpture for all eternity.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE | "Cement and Concrete" was born from creative unrest and artistic melancholy. I grew up painting, an inheritance from my father — a man with little education who drew and sculpted; worthless to many, yet of immeasurable value to me.

The silence of his art after he chose to end his life made me question: what is the worth of an artist? Who legitimises a poem, a film, a painting? This work explores the absurdity of subjectivism, ambition, and the ambiguity between fame and legacy — a tragic satire about two women in the arts and their their ferocious need to create.

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The Black Virgin

A film by Fany De La Chica

Fiction

Status: in development





In one of the poorest neighborhoods in Andalusia, Magdalena, a 12-year-old queer Roma girl, survives domestic violence by bullying a classmate. When summer arrives, an unexpected sexual attraction to her classmate and a family rebellion during the procession of the Black Virgin force her to confront the cycle of violence she has inherited and fight for her dream of a different future.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE IThe Black Virgin is a deeply personal film inspired by my upbringing in La Magdalena, a humble neighborhood in Jaén with strong Roma roots. Born into a matriarchal family, I was raised by resilient women like my grandmother, Mamá Lola, who led her household amid tradition and struggle. While studying at Columbia University, I returned to film The Looking Ceremony with local Roma women, exploring virginity from an intimate, respectful perspective. That experience inspired The Black Virgin, a work of fiction about a girl's awakening in which desire, identity, and freedom collide with the weight of social expectations and inherited beliefs.

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Justice In The Land Of Fog

Juanita Velez, a talented investigative reporter, has spent years navigating Colombia's peacebuilding process in the aftermath of Latin America's longest and deadliest armed conflict. Now she is on a mission to uncover the industry of judicial set-ups, a hidden and sophisticated form of political violence that silently targets hundreds of social leaders. Her personal journey intertwines with a poetic retrospective of women who are facing persecution, imprisonment, and harassment for standing up for their ideals.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE Usestice In The Land Of Fog is my first feature film as a director and producer. Beyond the challenge of discovering my own limits and capacities as a creator, here I also face the task of telling a story that is very close and personal. As a journalist, I have always been naturally driven by the desire to find answers and to organize and explain reality while maintaining a degree of distance. This project puts me in a diametrically opposed position in the sense that it starts from a story that pierces me and in which I am immersed: it is born from fear I have often felt for being myself a human rights defender in Latin America, and from watching a dear friend lose her freedom after being falsely accused of terrorism.

1645. In the chaos of the European conquest of the Americas, Ibátali, a young Kalinago indigenous girl, is married to a Frenchman in order to secure peace in Guadeloupe. Erasing her identity to survive, she clings to the illusion that bearing a child will protect her. When she meets Olaudah, a young Igbo maroon fugitive, their journey through the wild forest sends her on a path from alienation to emancipation—but freedom will demand the heaviest price.

PRODUCER'S NOTE III "Here the New World Begins" is the adaptation of Anne-Sophie Nanki's brilliant first short film. Her screenplay, a real page turner, unfolds the emancipatory journey of Ibátali - young Kalinago Native American forcibly married to a French plantation owner. From alienation to freedom, the director depicts her emotional and physical transformation. Dwelving us in Ibatali's subjectivity Anne-Sophie Nanki throws us in the turmoil of the hybrid 17th Century Creole society. As with her short film, she composes a visceral and immersive cinematographic experience through a compelling female gaze. Subtly blending poetry, historical and anthropological thoroughness the director offers a film that questions the very possibility of creating a common ground in a world carved out of violence and domination. Already buoyed by an Award for Best Feature Film Screenplay at Valence Scénario, we are participating in the Festival des Arcs looking for European partners.

Exploring the possibilities of criminal justice reform, Baya offers an immersive portrait of a community service worker from the first to the last day of their sentence at the Butte Pinson farm in Seine-Saint-Denis. Between contrasting worlds, shared experiences, successes and failures, the film reveals the reality of alternatives to prison.

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Malungas

A film by Letícia Simões, produced by Chaiana Furtado

90', Documentary

Malungas is a hybrid work between documentary and essay cinema that combines performance, archive material, and direct cinema. The film connects anti-slavery heroines in Brazil with Black migrant women in Portugal, using cooking, dance and embroidery as technologies of memory and resistance. Rooted in the Bantu notion of malungo, a symbolic kinship forged through the Atlantic Middle Passage, the film creates a living bridge between past and present, Brazil and Portugal, wound and future. Malungas fabulates new forms of belonging, where memory generates community, creating spaces of life, protection, and imagination.

PRODUCER'S NOTE As a producer, my motivation is to build bridges between Latin America and Europe through works that confront the History that shaped us. Malungas is a feature film but also a part of an ongoing artistic and research platform that investigates the Black Atlantic and its inherited forms of resistance, care and imagination. The project grew from a short film and is now developing as a feature. We are now seeking partners (coproduction, agent sales, distribution) to enlarge a process grounded in rigor, relation and historical consciousness.

1992. After completing a PhD in queer theory at the University of London, David returns to his native Barcelona, heartbroken after a failed love affair. Amid the euphoria of the Olympic Games and the shadow of the AIDS epidemic, he begins writing a diary to understand how love between men really works.

PRODUCER'S NOTE Men and Days addresses a universal theme: the search for and construction of one's own identity. It reflects on how we shape ourselves, both as individuals and as a community. Through David Vilaseca's own body and words, the film explores how we love, and learn to love, as gueer individuals.

Creating national and transnational queer references remains an essential task if we truly aspire to a diverse and democratic cinematic culture, and telling these stories from lived experience is both necessary and transformative. Reclaiming figures from our recent queer history, like David Vilaseca, is not only an act of memory and justice, but also a way to recognise their cultural and human legacy, and to honour lives that were key to advancing rights and shaping a more inclusive collective imaginary.

Rivo, a 12-year-old boy adopted from Madagascar, lives with his family in a small village in the Catalan Pyrenees. When his parents show him the documents from his adoption, he discovers that his birth name was Fahendrenasana Etienne. The revelation unsettles him, especially as he starts secondary school and realises he is the only Black child in a mostly white environment. As he begins to search for his biological mother and his origins, Rivo starts to question where he truly belongs, and what defines who he is.

PRODUCER'S NOTE Laura is a Barcelona-based producer who transitioned into cinema after twelve years in television, where she produced successful shows across diverse formats. She brought a solid foundation in production management and team leadership, now applied to creative, director-driven theatrical projects. In 2024, she was selected for the Emerging Female Producers Programme "Acció Producció" run by Dones Visuals (Catalan Association of Women in Film). In 2025, she joined EURODOC, the international training programme for creative documentary producers, and was selected as an emerging talent by CIMA (Spanish Association of Women in Film), earning a place in their highly competitive nine-month mentorship program. Laura is currently producing a creative documentary for the reputed Spanish production company Nanouk Films while developing three feature projects through her own company, Bretzel & Tequila.
